

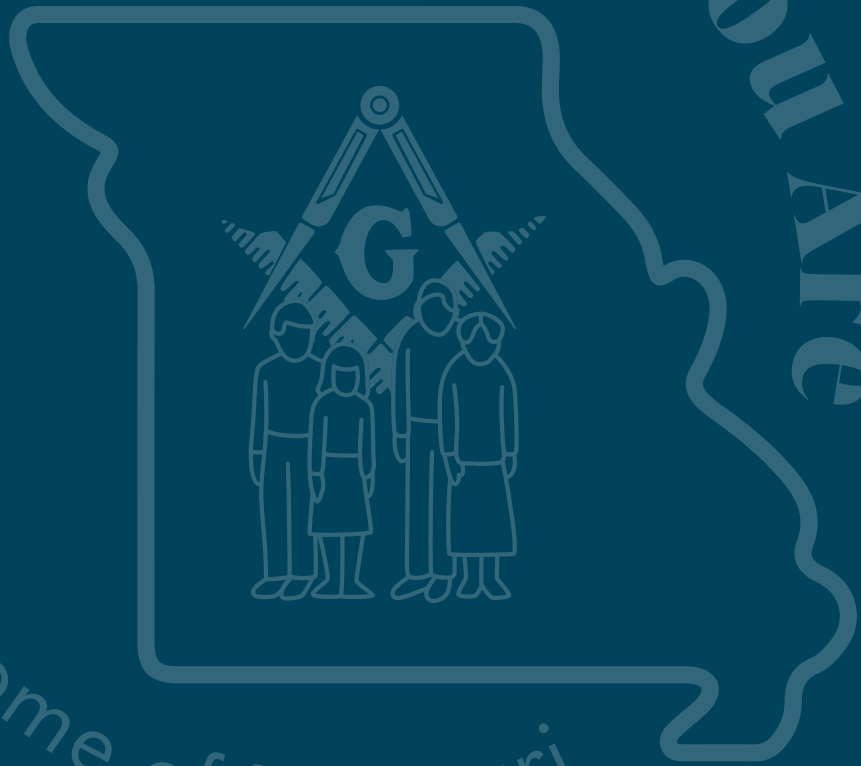

There are two big stories for me as I look at this past fiscal year. The first is that we once again provided over \$2.2 million in direct financial assistance, with it being closely divided between our Financial Assistance Programs and Partnership Programs. The second big story is not one of big dollar amounts, but of bringing back a program — Partnering To Honor.

The Financial Assistance Programs are what I consider to be the core mission of the Masonic Home. These are the programs that help Missouri Masons, their wives, honored widows, female members of the Order of the Eastern Star, and their dependent children. One of our goals for several years now has been to specifically grow our Long-Term Financial Assistance Program, which helps our elderly members that have outlived their resources.

While we would like to continue to see growth in the Long-Term Assistance Program, I was very pleased to see that we did see an increase in assistance this past year for those members.

I have a special ask to everyone reading this report — please make sure that family members know about the Masonic Home of Missouri and its ability to help. We find often that the adult child of a Mason or Masonic Widow is the person helping figure out what care needs and financial needs their parent is facing. Too often, they have no idea that the Masonic Home might be able to help their dad or mom.

In addition, please help us make sure that Masonic Widows are aware that assistance might be available, even years after their husbands have passed. As always, we encourage you to call us to make a referral. The

person does not necessarily need to have a financial issue, rather we can help inform them of the various programs the Masonic Home has in case they should ever have a need.

I am particularly excited that we started to see our Partnering To Honor Program (PTH) come back this year. The PTH Program is a matching program just like the Creating-A-Partnership (CAP) Program. PTH is focused on veterans, helping fund Honor Flights and care packages for both veterans and those currently serving. Coming out of the COVID pandemic, our Partnership Programs struggled. The Board of Directors first turned their attention to getting CAP to come back — which helps Missouri children in need. After two successful years of recovery with CAP, it was time to work on PTH.

The Board changed the match to mirror the CAP match. So, every dollar raised by a Lodge or Chapter is now matched by \$2 from the Masonic Home. A Lodge or Chapter could raise up to \$15,000 per fiscal year, putting up to \$45,000 in their communities through PTH. At the same time that this change was being made, the Masonic Home learned that The Food Bank for Central & Northeast Missouri had a Veteran's VIP pack. This was additional assistance provided to any veteran that visits The Food Bank.

A call went out to the Lodges and Chapters in the Central and Northeast Missouri Food

Bank area to see if they would raise funds to help support this program. In just three months, combined with the Masonic Home's match, they raised over \$21,000. What was truly remarkable about this was the idea of Lodges and Chapters coming together across a wide area to raise funds together. It was truly the "Power of the Collective." We had five Lodges and Chapters participate for the very first time in a Partnership Program.

While this was all happening, Ivanhoe Lodge No. 446 was planning a big fundraising endeavor, a BBQ contest, to raise money for Honor Flights. This particular project was a great example of a Lodge coming together to work, and it was a lot of work, to raise money in their community. I had the opportunity to join some of the Lodge members at the airport for the return of the Honor Flight that they helped to sponsor. If you have never welcomed back our heroes, the men and women who were willing to give their lives for us, I encourage you to do this. It was an incredibly moving experience.

Feeding a child. Thanking a veteran. Fulfilling your obligation. Big and small acts of kindness. It was an incredible year. I am often amazed at all that we can accomplish together. In a world that sometimes seems just dark and angry, I know there is light — thank you for being that light.

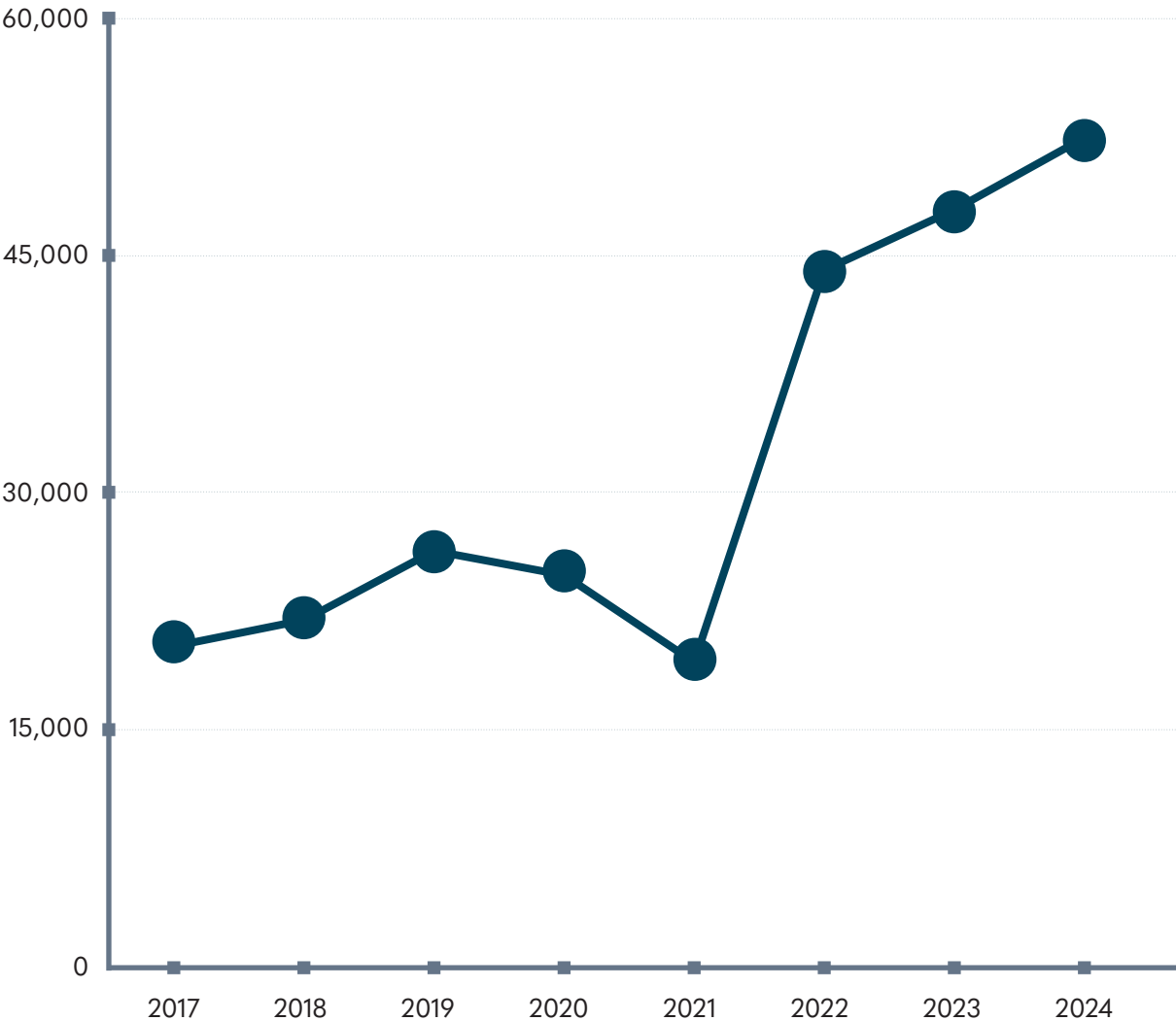

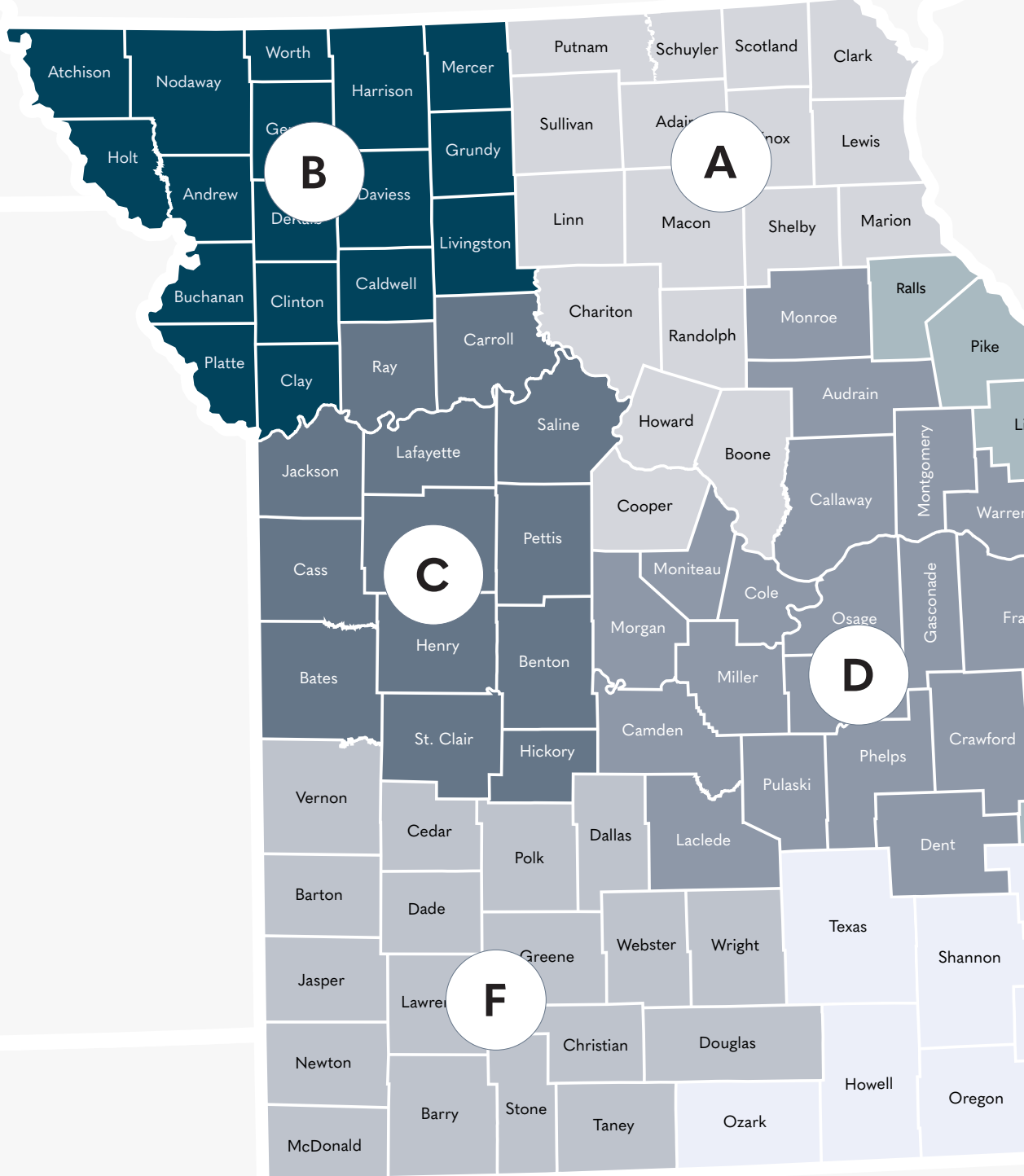

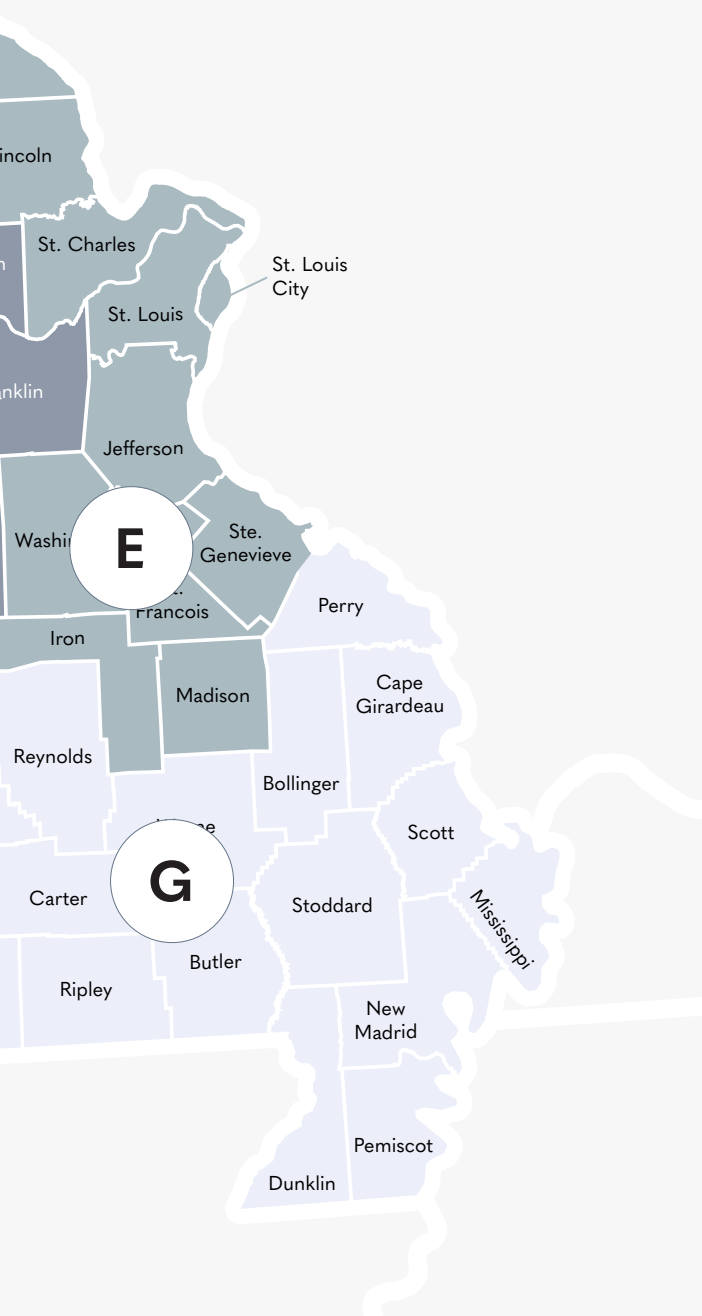

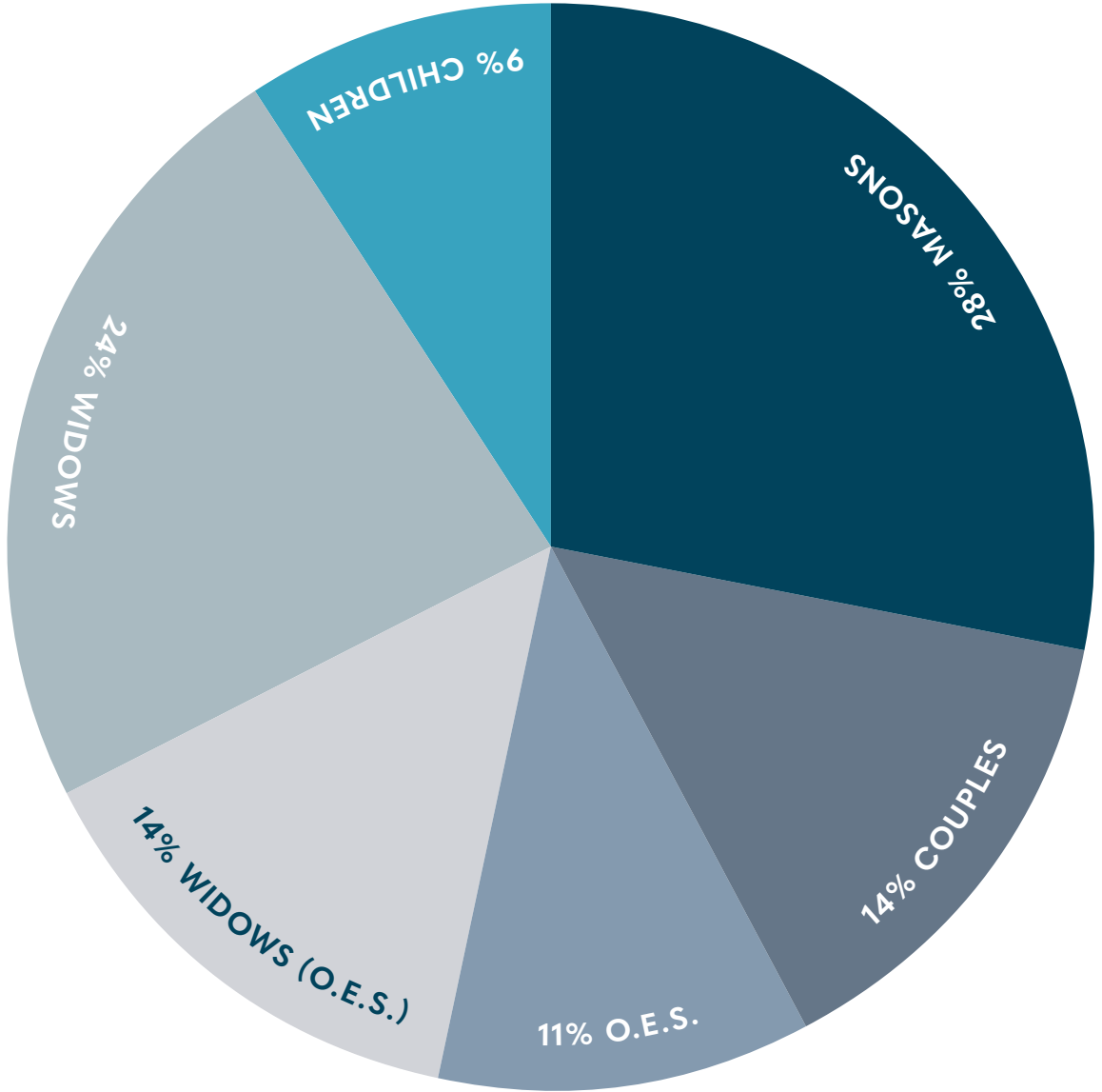

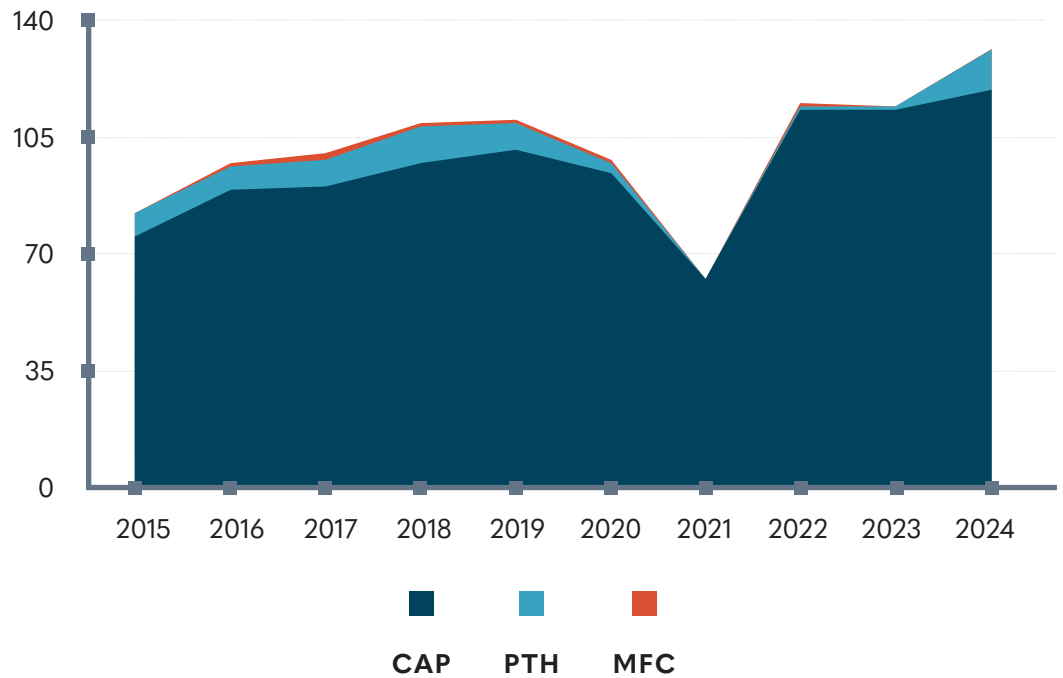

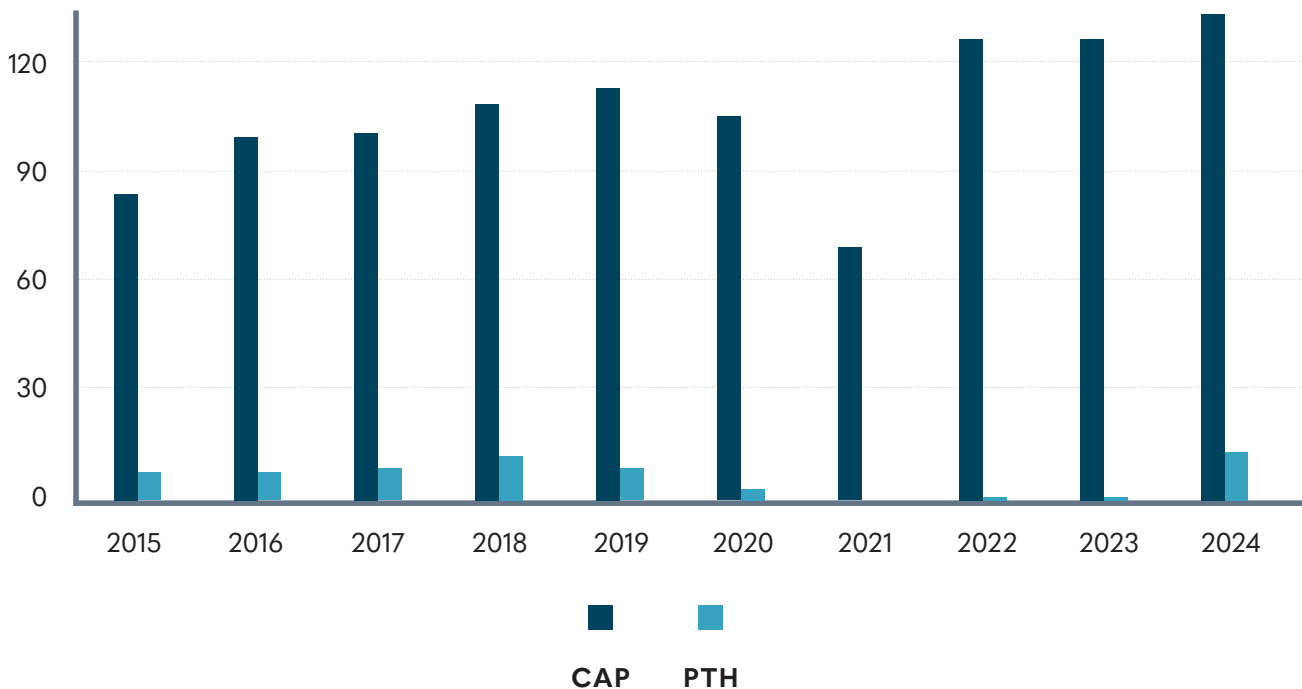

This tagline embraces the notion that together we really can make a difference. Partnerships provide a fantastic chance to create a significant influence. The Masonic Home of Missouri's Partnership Programs are a perfect example of how our Missouri Masonic Families can work collectively to strengthen their connections within their communities.

If you have been following the journey of these two programs, you are aware that the COVID-19 pandemic had a detrimental impact. Honor Flights came to an abrupt end, children's needs rose, and fundraising efforts became challenging as the world paused.

In the efforts to quickly rebuild the Creating-A-Partnership Program (CAP) post pandemic, the Masonic Home Board of Directors approved a double match incentive. This meant that for every \$1 raised by a Lodge or Chapter, they could put \$3 back into communities for children.

With a maximum match of \$30,000, each Lodge or Chapter has the opportunity to donate \$45,000 to the needs of children in their community. This change made a significant and quick impact across the state. And because of the continuation of this double match, for the first time in its 20 years, CAP broke the \$1 million mark in direct assistance in FY2023. This impressive number is due to the collective efforts of our Masonic Families. The ongoing

success and expansion of the CAP Program is remarkable, with numerous grateful testimonials and increased participation, it is a reminder of the great work that can be done when we pool our resources, time, and talents.

A New Challenge — Partnering To Honor

The Partnering To Honor Program (PTH) is a matching funds program that provides an opportunity for the Masonic Home, Lodges, and Chapters to join together to help fund Honor Flights and care packages for veterans and active duty military personnel. During the pandemic, Honor Flights came to a halt and the program struggled to regain its footing in a post-pandemic world.

In 2023, the Masonic Home set about finding a solution to bring back the program. Could PTH follow the same model as CAP, with its Masonic Home double-match of Lodge and Chapter donations? Thanks to

VIP Veteran Packs

The essence of the program lies in supporting veterans in our communities, ensuring they receive not only the gratitude they deserve for their service but also the assistance they need during challenging times. Today, not yet a year after the initial discussion to revitalize and grow Partnering To Honor, we proudly share the success stories that will inspire the next chapter of generosity from communities.

The Masonic Home recently began a partnership with The Food Bank for Central & Northeast Missouri to help with their VIP Veteran Pack Program. The timeline: 90 days. The goal: \$15,000. The result — over \$21,000 raised to provide over 800 VIP Veteran Packs.

Collectively, the nine Lodges and Chapters that gathered together to help this cause — they are the leaders showing us what can be done when the call is made for help. (See page 35 for the list of participants.)

We extend a heartfelt thanks to RWB Ashley Young and RWB Mike Flagg for their support and efforts to lead the task force to bring about action and awareness. We ask that you join us so we can keep going with this much-needed resource for our veterans in our communities. Honor Flights

Honor Flights began in 2005 to help veterans visit their war memorials in Washington D.C. The Masonic Home is not affiliated with the Honor Flight Program but works with Lodges and Chapters to help fund this program, so our deserving veterans can make the trip. Earlier this year, Ivanhoe Lodge No. 446 organized a BBQ event aimed at raising funds for the Honor Flight Network of Kansas City. This gathering not only brought the community together for a day of good food but also achieved an incredible outcome: a generous donation of \$18,000. This contribution will help support the mission to honor and transport veterans to visit the memorials dedicated to their service and sacrifices. The event was a resounding success, demonstrating the Lodge's commitment to giving back and making a positive impact in the lives of our local heroes.

HOW DOES THE PTH DOUBLE-MATCH WORK?

\$1 = \$3

The Masonic Home will match \$2 for every \$1 raised by a Lodge or Chapter for a maximum of \$45,000 per fiscal year — that's **\$45,000 per Lodge or Chapter.** How much could your Lodge or Chapter raise for veterans in your community?



The average age for Vietnam veterans is in the 70s. Korean and WWII veterans — even older, explains Scott Sheridan, President of Honor Flight Network KC. “Many times this is the last trip they take ... For Vietnam veterans, this is a chance to start to heal and receive the welcome home they never got.”

Earlier this year, an ask came in from Ivanhoe Lodge No. 446. They invited Masonic Home Executive Director Barbara Ramsey to join the judging panel for a BBQ competition, an event organized by the Lodge, with the goal of raising funds for the Honor Flight Network of Kansas City.

Brother Mason Sewing, the grandson of a veteran, wanted to find a way to honor his grandfather, as well as other veterans, by providing funds to support an honor flight. His plan and his determination to make a difference set in motion an event that will take place annually for a cause that he and his Lodge believe in supporting.

The timeline: A day of BBQ, crafts, fundraising, and friendly competition. The goal: Present a check to the Honor Flight KC organization to support their upcoming flight. The result — an incredible \$18,000!

If we work together, we can succeed together. Can your Lodge or Chapter follow in the steps of those who are leading the charge to honor those who served our country?

I am both proud and humbled to report that, for the third consecutive year, with your help, the Masonic Home provided over \$2 million — precisely \$2,226,171 — in direct assistance to help your Masonic Brothers and Sisters, children, and veterans statewide. This assistance touched the lives of approximately 52,293 people. Dollars provided increased by 3% over last year and lives touched increased by 9.4%. This was another record-setting year — thank you!

Several comparisons between this fiscal year and the last are worth noting. Total operating revenues increased by 16%, attributable entirely to the increase in investment income. Individual giving remained fairly consistent with the prior year, with some fundraising events supported more strongly than others. The Hope for the Holidays Campaign, for example, drew 7% more support than last year, while estate giving declined drastically, by 86%. Individual donor support continued to exceed pre-pandemic support levels.

Donations and estate gifts funded 48% of direct Outreach assistance (versus 92% last year), with the remaining assistance and all administrative expenses funded by investments. On the bright side, this means that 100% of every donor dollar went to help clients. However, this is also why it is so important to maintain solid investment funds — if our reserves weren't at the levels they are, we would not be able to provide the amount of assistance we provide. Donor support at current levels, while imperative and greatly appreciated, does not meet the annual need of the clients.

Total expenses increased by 6%, with program expenses accounting

for 41% of the increase. Total assets increased by 7% due to market appreciation.

Year after year, I write about the IRS Public Support Test. This topic has been on the forefront of my mind for over a decade. Each year, I explain how a century of excellent stewardship led to substantial investment balances, which led to significant investment income. At the same time, bequests and other donations decreased dramatically, making it impossible to meet the one-third threshold. While the IRS requires that 33.3% of total revenue over a five-year period come from

donations, the Masonic Home had been coming in less than 30% and decreasing each year. Although we failed the test for multiple years, we can now say that, due to strategies put in place several years ago, we have passed the test for the second consecutive year.

Although a real issue, I recognize that IRS rules are not an inspiring reason to continue supporting an organization. But, the ability of the charity to continue providing the services needed is inspiring, and seeing how many lives are touched each year and hearing the individual stories tells how necessary it is to

continue the work of the Masonic Home.

I've also written about restricted versus unrestricted assets, again, not a very inspiring topic until you think about it in terms of liquidity, or access. While providing for the needs of thousands of Brothers, Sisters, and children over the years, Masonic Home boards and staff carefully cared for the assets, ensuring they would continue to grow. As it stands today, the Masonic Home has nearly \$26 million in assets that can be accessed. This excludes restricted investments and assets like building and equipment. If all revenue streams stopped today, the Masonic Home would exhaust these funds in just under five years. A Board-restricted fund would provide for another ten years of operations at current expense levels.

The Masonic Home is extremely strong in

this regard compared to many non-profits who attempt to hold six months of reserves before having to close their doors. However, when considering the Masonic Home's 135-year legacy, five years of assets seems very short, even when adding another ten-year security net.

The Masonic Home has been blessed with a century of committed boards and staff, along with generous donors, all of which contributed to the organization's strong financial position. That strength depends on the continued commitment and generosity of those who believe in the mission of the Masonic Home ... those who want to continue touching the lives of tens of thousands each year. Together, we can ensure that this amazing organization is available to help generation after generation.

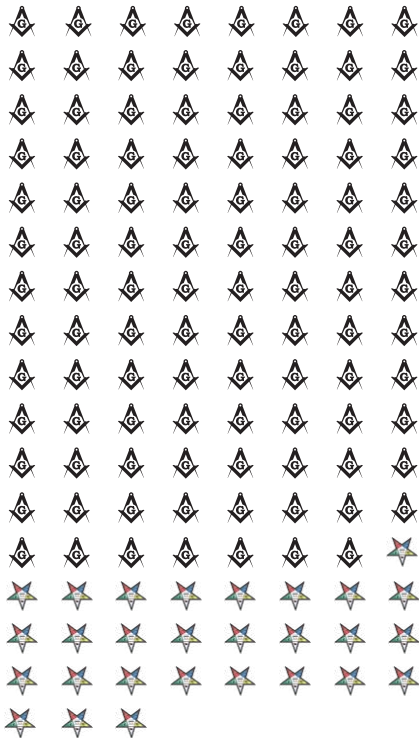

Program costs came in at **69%** of total expenses, with the remainder used for administrative purposes.

That means that 69 cents of every dollar spent by the Masonic Home was spent to help our clients, children, widows, and veterans. The significant administration portion is mainly due to building management and Grand Lodge database expenses.

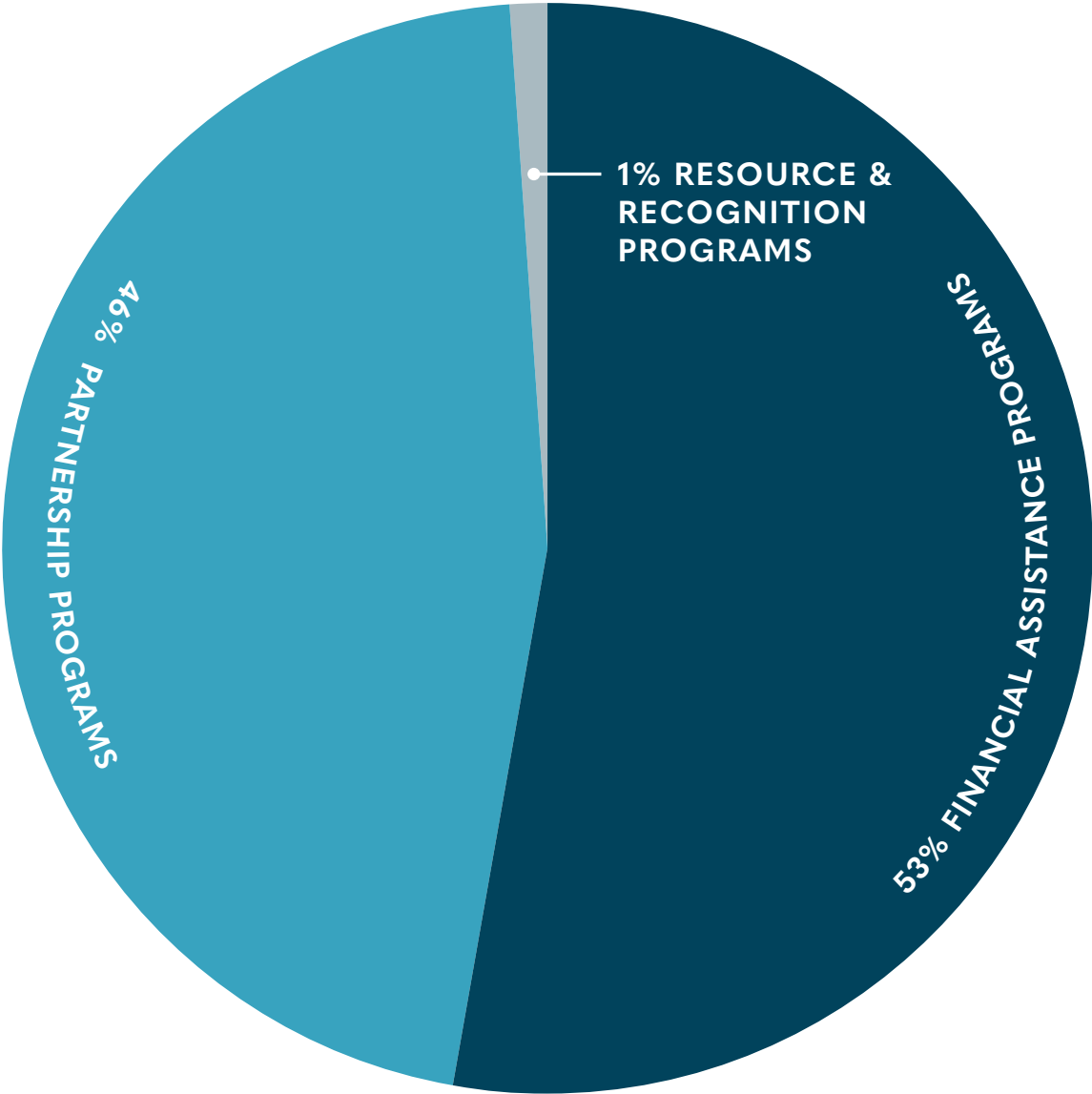

The operating deficit for the year continues to be the result of the planned, multi-year, investment income reduction strategy to assist in passing the IRS Form 990 Public Support Test.

The financial statements of the Masonic Home of Missouri were audited by Williams-Keepers, LLC. For the year ended June 30, 2024, the Masonic Home received a clean, unqualified audit opinion. No adjustments to the records of the Masonic Home were recommended by the auditors during their audit, nor were any recommendations made to management regarding the fiscal operations of the Masonic Home.

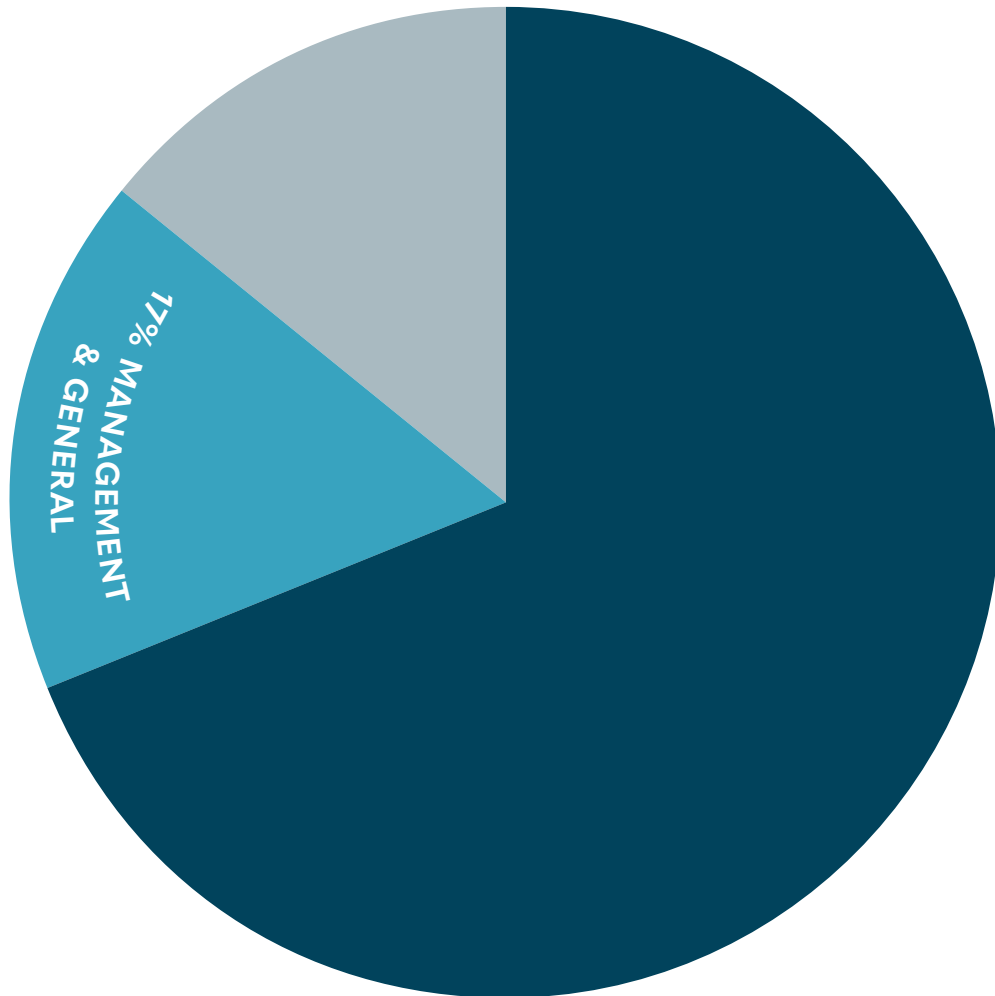

EXPENSES BY FUNCTION

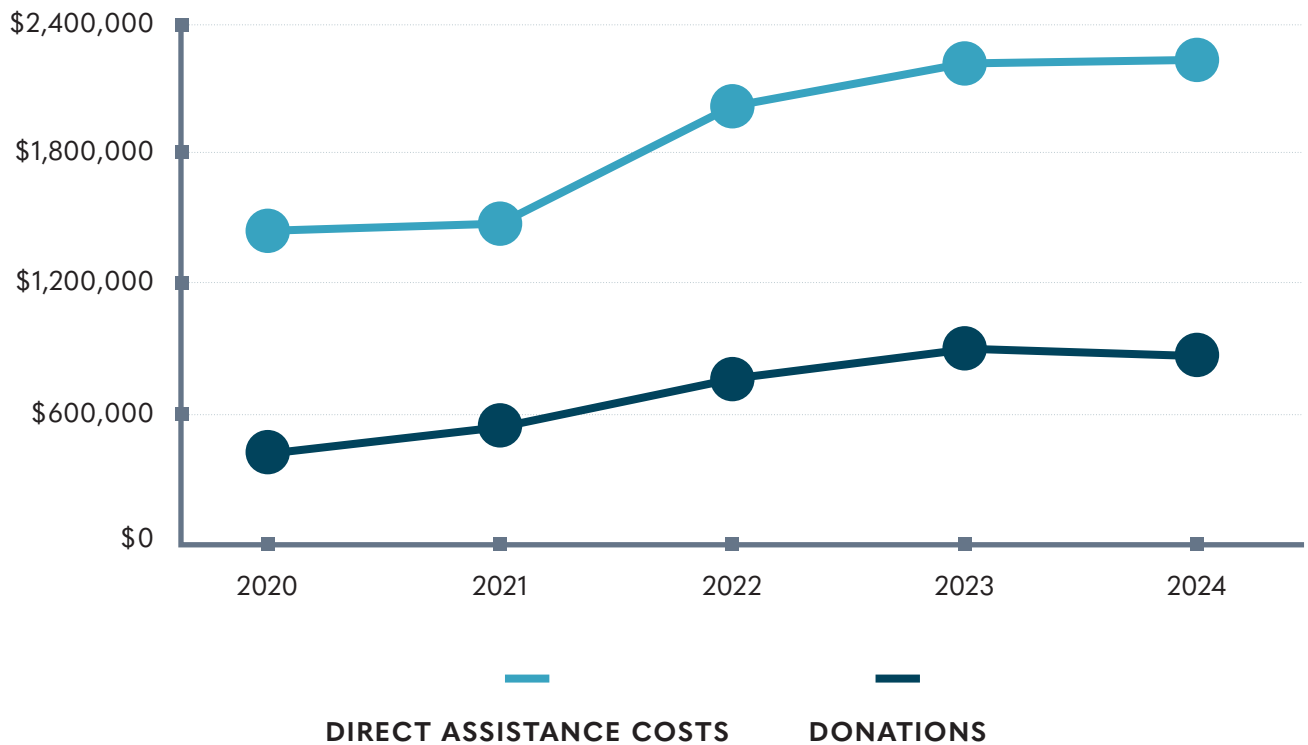

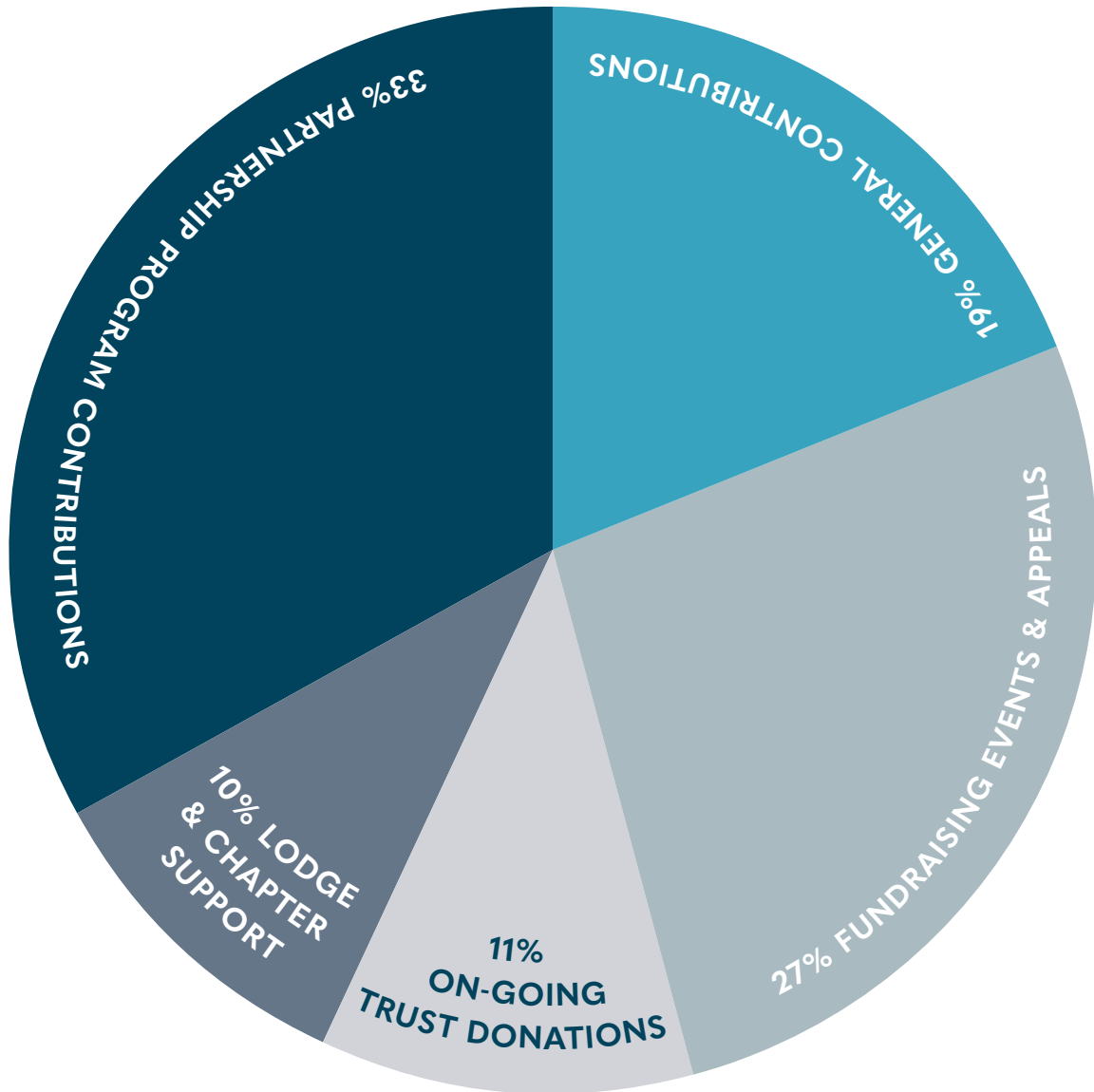
DIRECT ASSISTANCE COSTS VS. DONATIONS

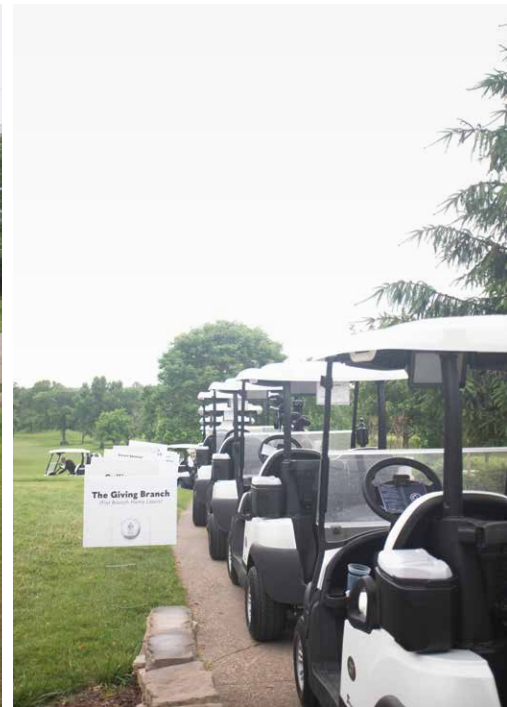
